





	Nancy Tuaine	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Listener survey conducted through Neilsens to get feedback and contribution for future of AwaFM.</li> <li>• 210 people responded. Although 163 people had actively listened in last 3 months.</li> <li>• Results provided in Annual Report.</li> <li>• 3 ways to listen to AwaFM is by iheart app, Where Korero(iwi collective programme) or on the Radio. Preference is radio.</li> <li>• 63% listen mainly in morning, in Whanganui district and 21% via apps outside of Whanganui. Mid morning 50%, 30% lunch time, 42% in afternoon. Listening in the Car is main audience.</li> <li>• Future aims – 49% want to see live streaming, 42% want video interviews available online, 40% talk back and current affairs podcasts. Kapa haka is a good example of audience choosing when to watch.</li> </ul>

Reo strategy remains priority.</li> <li>• Outputs of reo Māori, use and target audience referred to in p.13 of report.</li> <li>• 3 priorities: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– 1. Bringing life, through use of archives. Acknowledged work of Jane to digitalise. Whanganuitanga from archives being used as current korero as well as creating new content, new narrative and reminder of history. Efforts made to visit marae, being part of kaumatua sessions etc.</li> <li>– 2. How to stay current and connected to people. More content and current iwi kōrero needed for programs. Need to increase outside broadcasts. Currently cover kapa haka, Ratana celebrations but need more Kaupapa to broadcast from. Team reviewing and sharing ideas on how to accomplish that. Website is one of main ways to engage. Desire to create more in social media space to increase audience.</li> <li>– 3. Improving broadcast. Challenging thinking to expand beyond goals on improvement of programmes. It is a priority for financial year but needs to be consistent with reo and mita goals.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
